

**Report**  
**One-Day Workshop and Poster Making Competition on "Cyber Crime"**  
**16-10-2023**

On October 16, 2023, under the guidance of Principal Dr. Rishipal and the presidency of Vice-Principal Dr. Ishwar Singh, hosted a one-day workshop and poster making competition on the topic "Cyber Crime." The event was skillfully organized by the Legal Literacy Cell, led by Dr. Mukesh Chahal. The main speaker for the event was Sub-Inspector Shubhranshu from Haryana Police, Kaithal.

The event began with Vice-Principal Dr. Ishwar Singh welcoming the chief guest and speaker, Sub-Inspector Shubhranshu, with warm words. Dr. Mukesh Chahal conducted the stage proceedings efficiently. Sub-Inspector Shubhranshu elaborated on the various cyber crimes prevalent today, especially those related to financial fraud. He warned students about phishing, lottery scams, hacking, QR code misuse, and fake requests. He emphasized the importance of using strong passwords and secure sites. In his address, the main speaker explained the different types of cyber crimes:

**Spam Emails:** These emails can damage computers and lead to system failures.

**Hacking:** Unauthorized access to private information such as usernames or passwords and altering them.

**Phishing:** Sending spam emails to obtain personal information that can be used to cause harm.

**Fake Bank Calls:** Scammers impersonate bank officials to extract ATM numbers and passwords, threatening account closure if the information is not provided. He stressed that banks never ask for such details through email, phone calls, or messages.

Expert Krishna Kumar discussed crimes related to social media and how to avoid them. The speakers highlighted the increasing incidence of cyber crime and the need for awareness to control it. They advised not to share OTPs with strangers and outlined the various tricks used by cyber criminals.

Dr. Mukesh Chahal mentioned that a poster making competition was also held to raise awareness about cyber crime prevention. Students actively participated, creating posters on mobile application fraud, computer hacking, and OTP/credit card fraud. She emphasized that identifying the various forms of cyber crime is the first step towards protecting oneself.

Dr. Mukesh Chahal also discussed measures to prevent banking and ATM fraud. She noted that as the world becomes more digital, cyber crimes are rising. Therefore, caution and awareness in the virtual world are essential for safety.
